REPORT ON NEW FURNITURE: part two

Starting with some neat solutions for seating, sleeping, and space division

Gertrude Dinsmore is being manufactured for this firm in Italy. Supports for the cane-seated round stool are lacily intertwined with blond rattan, wrapped at intervals to the circumference of the seat, which measures 16 inches in diameter. Triangular leather seat tops a sturdy frame of criss-crossed rattan, fastened with blond rattan. The stools retail at approximately \$37.50 each.











m. singer & sons: Below, a sampling from this firm's new offerings includes two occasional tables by Ico Parisi, as well as a neat bar stool. For table illustrated in photograph 1, a tier of glass provides both additional surface area, and shelter for precious objects on the lower walnut shelf, which is partitioned by crescent-shaped separaters. Measuring 40-inches square, it is supported on brass legs, retails about \$275. Other Parisi table (3) has slatted magazine shelf, suspended drawer beneath its quartered walnut surface. On brass legs, it is 50 inches long, to retail at about \$300. Brass wishbone legs support foam upholstered bar stool seat (2), which measures 28 inches high, to retail for approximately \$100.











pace designs, inc.: Above, from the Pace collection of oil-finished walnut furniture, we illustrate I. M. Rosen's 36-inch wide man's chest, as well as a trim 60-inch desk. Rectangular ebony pulls provide access to six drawers and a left-hand cabinet fitted with three adjustable shirt shelves for the chest, and to three small drawers and a file drawer for the desk. The chest retails for about \$260, and the desk, topped with woodgrain Micarta, at \$280.
